Recommended steps to support dissemination (1)

- Share information/announcement about the launch of the KCD and POC Toolkit with national stakeholders
- Reach out to partners working on POC EID and VL in your country to discuss and coordinate dissemination efforts.
 - In joint CHAI/UNICEF/ASLM and EGPAF project countries: UNICEF to take the lead
 - In EGPAF only project countries: EGPAF to take the lead
 - Please also reach out to/engage WHO and CDC country colleagues when planning dissemination activities. Both officially endorsed the KCD and contributed guidance and tools to the Toolkit.

Recommended steps to support dissemination (1)

- Define the key audiences you want to reach at the country (i.e. MoH officials, lab and HIV programme managers, policymakers, donors, implementing partners, etc.) with the goal of being inclusive and broad-based in your approach.
- Use existing opportunities to disseminate the KCD and POC Toolkit (e.g. TWGS, national programme meetings) or plan a specific dissemination event.
- Track dissemination (who, what, where, when, how) as well as any TA support needs articulated by stakeholders.
